

TRANSGENDER VOTING GUIDE

Your vote, your voice, and YOU matter! North Carolina has a Voter ID law, meaning voters are required to show an acceptable form of photo ID before casting a vote. Here is what you need to know.

Document Requirements

Name: Name on ID and Voter Registration HAS TO MATCH.

Photo: Must “reasonably resemble” your appearance.

Gender Marker: Gender Marker on ID and Voter Registration DOES NOT HAVE TO MATCH.



To update your name on your voter registration, scan the QR Code above.

Deadlines

Typically changes to your voter registration must be made 25 days before Election Day. But you may also change your name on your voter registration if you vote in-person during Early Voting.



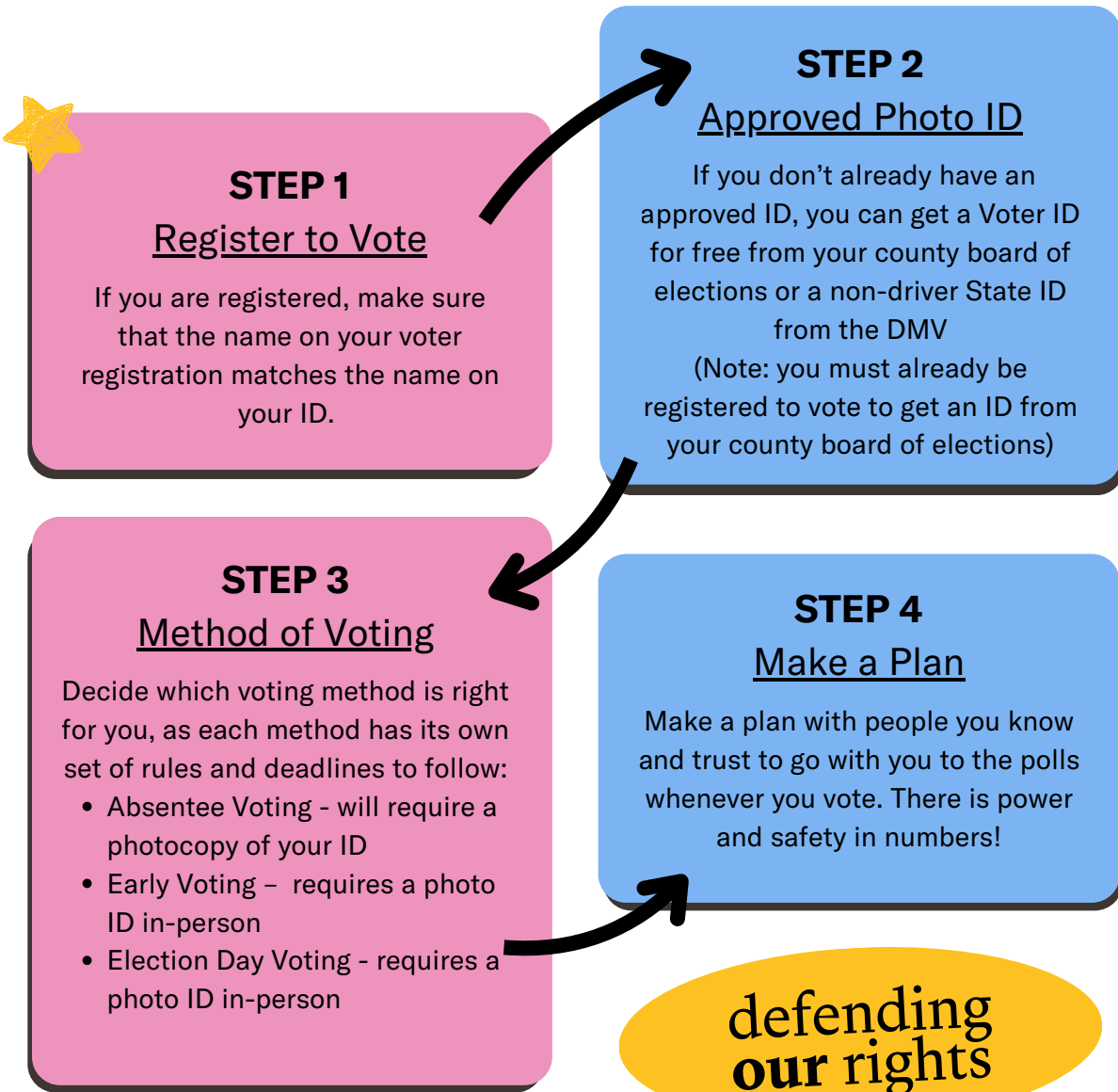

Trouble at the Polls?

While an individual poll worker can question your identification, they cannot turn you away solely based on your appearance. Instead, the judges of election at the polling place must ALL agree that the photo doesn't have a reasonable resemblance to your physical appearance to prevent you from voting a regular ballot. If this happens, don't despair! You have a right to vote via a provisional ballot. Don't hesitate to ask for one!

Make sure to ask the poll worker who provides the provisional ballot what the next steps are. Call or text 888-687-8683 to confirm that the instructions you received are accurate.
